Middle Level Education, as defined by the Nashua Board of Education, is provided to students in Grades 7, 8. Effective September 2004, Middle Level Education will include Grades 6, 7 and 8.

The components of Middle Level Education include an emphasis on a student-centered program; development of effective learning communities; interdisciplinary planning; block scheduling; establishing small group student/teacher relationships; parents as active partners; accountability; and program evaluation.

- a. Team teaching of a small community of learners consists of two or more teachers who provide the educational program for a set group of students.
- b. Interdisciplinary planning is the connection and integration of content purposefully planned to maximize learning.

c.
