



9. The evaluator must be permitted to directly communicate and share information with members of the IEP team, the district's special education director, and the director's designees. The evaluator must also release the assessments and results, including any parent/guardian and teacher questionnaires, to members of the IEP team, the district's special education director, and the director's designees.
10. The evaluator will participate in the evaluation review meeting, in person or virtually. When the evaluator is unable to participate, an individual who can interpret the instructional implications of the evaluation results may attend.
11. The district shall be entitled to inspect and obtain copies of the evaluator's records, including any records created by third parties. However, those records will not be deemed accessible to any school district personnel other than the evaluator, unless and until the district exercises its right to inspect or obtain copies of those records from the evaluator.

Parents/guardians have a right to request an Independent Educational Evaluation (IEE) at public expense when the parent/guardian disagrees with the school district's evaluation. The provision for
